Chairman Flynn of the Fire & Police Com. reported favorable upon the petition of Fire Chief Rogers to have the fire wagon varnished and unfavorable for the purchase of a new team of horses ald. Matthews made a motion seconded by ald. Boyer that the report be accepted and ratified upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

J.F. Green not to be special Police

Chairman Flynn of the Fire & Police Com. reported unfavorable upon the petition of J.F. Green to be appointed special Police at a salary of ten dollars per month, ald. Matthews made a motion seconded by ald. Drew that the report of Committee be accepted and ratified upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Petition of La Court Hotel denied

Chairman Flynn of the Fire & Police Com. reported unfavorable upon the verbal petition of J.F. Lumsden to build a frame annex on the La Court Hotel, thereupon ald. Matthews made a motion seconded by ald. Drew that the report of Com. be adopted and ratified upon call of motion vote was

upon ald. Davier made a motion seconded by ald. Plank that the
appointments made by the Mayor be accepted and ratified upon call
of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Protest against
repeal of Bicycle
Path Ord.

J. M. Stewart presented a petition signed
by several hundred people protesting against the repeal of the
Ordinance protecting bicycle paths in the City, ald. Flynn made
a motion seconded by ald. Hudson that said petition be laid over
until next regular meeting, upon call of motion said motion
carried unanimously.

ald. Hertz made a motion seconded by ald.
Boyer that the City atty be instructed to prepare an Ordinance
for a Bond issue of \$400,000 to build a mountain water system,
upon call of motion said motion lost unanimously.

Council unanimous
for Mtn Water

ald. Boyer made a motion seconded by
ald. Plank to get the sense of Council to ascertain the most
feasible plan to secure mountain water and whether they
want it or not, upon call of motion said motion carried
unanimously.

Water Mains
to be extended.

Chairman Davis of the Water Sewers and
Light Com. advised Council that the Com. desired to make
some permanent improvements on the distributing system which
would involve the expenditure of about \$4,000.00 and desired
to have the endorsement of Council on same, ald. Matthews made
a motion seconded by ald. Drew that the water Com. proceed
to make the improvements at such places as in their
judgment such improvements are most necessarily needed,
upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Proposition to
settle Kittle
Case

City atty Rozzelle reported that he had
tried to effect a settlement with F. M. Kittle for injuries received
by falling on defective sidewalk on 7th + Colv. ave. but was unav-
ersful. Thereupon ald. Flynn made a motion seconded
by ald. Hudson that the Council authorize the City atty
to offer Mr. Kittle's atty \$150.00 for a settlement in full
for all claims that he may have against the City of

Grand Junction, upon call of roll vote was as follows, ald. Davies
