applies for
Saloon License

W.A. Lynch & Co. presented a petition, making application for license to keep a saloon at South 5th St. on the north 17^{1/2} feet of lots 29-30-31+32 in Block 117 of the City of Grand Junction. from Sept 15th 1907 to April 17th 1908. with authority to sell therein spirituous, vinous and malt liquors in quantities less than one gallon. said petition was signed by the following owners of lots in the South half of Block ^{the north 4 1/2 feet} 117. P.F. Flucken lot #28 a.a. Miller agent for R.A. Miller lots 29-30-31+32 J.H. Schieswohl lot #17 Wm Strunk lots #18+19 A.P. Drew lots 20+21 and Fily McC. Maupin by Jos. H. Maupin agt for lot 24. their petition read as follows; To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of Grand Junction, We the undersigned, who represent a majority of the owners of lots in the South half of block 117. in the City of Grand Junction, State of Colorado; and at least one of whom owns the property adjoining the lot hereinafter described, respectfully petition your honorable body to grant a retail liquor dealers license to W.A. Lynch & Co. and that he be granted permission to conduct and operate a retail liquor store on the north twenty feet of lots 29-30-31+32 in block 117 and thus your petitioners would ever pray.

E.J. Hill and six others petitioned for the water main to be extended on Chipita ave, between 8th & 9th Streets. this was referred to the Com. on water sewer & lights.

City Engineer
located post

City Engineer Amalley reported that he had completed the survey of the South east corner of this section. having located the position of the corner post, but he added that the post could not be so located with regard to the City streets and map without causing

financial loss to one or more taxpayers whose property adjoins 12th Street. He therefore requested that the Street and Alley or some special committee go over the ground with him and hear his reasons for disturbing certain present titles before taking final action. Thereupon ald. Davies made a motion seconded by ald. Plank that the Street and Alley Com. in conjunction with the City Engineer take up this matter for final disposition and they be given power to act. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

The Street and Alley Com. reported favorable upon the petition requesting a cement sidewalk to be ordered laid along and in front of lots 25 + 26 Block 81 thereupon ald. Davies made a motion seconded by ald. Drew that the report of the S & A. Com. be accepted and affirmed upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Chief Rogers exonerated

Chairman Flynn of the Fire & Police Com. stated that in the opinion of himself and the other members of the Com. there was no basis on which the Council was justified in going ahead and probing the truth or the falsity of the charges preferred against Fire Chief Rogers and recommended that the matter be dropped. ald. Drew made a motion seconded by ald. Matthews that the report of the Fire & Police Com. be accepted and sustained, upon call of motion said motion carried.

Book Cliff Ry gets Coal Contract

ald. Davies made a motion seconded by ald. Hudson that the bid of the Book Cliff Ry to furnish coal for the City water works, be accepted and the City atty be instructed to draw up a contract for same to expire in one year from date, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

ald. Hudson made a motion seconded by ald. Boyer that a permit be granted ~~to~~ Wm Butthorn to build a frame addition on the La Court Hotel. Mayor Wentworth ruled that the motion was out of order account that Ord. #6 states that such must be done by resolution. thereupon ald. Boyer made a motion seconded by ald. Hudson that this matter lay over until next regular meeting, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
