Roll Call

Convened in second regular monthly session. Mayor Wentworth presiding, upon call of roll the following responded present aldermen Davies, Drew, Flynn, Hertz, Hudson, Matthews, Plank and City Atty Razzelle ald. Boyar arrived a few minutes late.

Minutes

The minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Pet to extend

Water main from 12<sup>th</sup> St. to 200 feet beyond 13<sup>th</sup> St. to 14<sup>th</sup> St this was referred to the Water, Sewers and Light Com.

W.R. Haines was present and on behalf of the Fair Assoc and Chamber of Commerce made a verbal request of Council to appropriate \$200.00 to be used for decorating and illuminating the streets from the Depot to Main & 10<sup>th</sup> Sts during Fair week, the appropriation to be used in conjunction with the business bodies mentioned, therupon ald. Davies made a motion seconded by ald. Boyar that the City Council appropriate \$100.00 to be used for decorating and illuminating the streets during Fair week, providing The Fair Assoc, Chamber of Commerce and other parties concerned decorate and illuminate as suggested by Mr. Haines, upon call of roll vote was as follows, ald. Davies yea, Drew yea, Boyar yea, Flynn yea, Hertz yea.

Hudson yea, Matthews yea, Plant yea, motion carried.  
 The street and alley Committee recommended  
 Sidewalks ordered laid. that Cement sidewalk be ordered laid as follows Lots 11 to 15 Inc.  
 B. 116. Lots 1 to 10 Inc. B 115. Lots 25 to 32 Inc. B. 85. Ald Davies  
 made a motion seconded by Ald. Plant that the report of the

 laid. upon call of roll vote was as follows, Ald. Davies yea, Drew

Ord. #146 passed and adopted.  
 Ordinance #146, "An Ordinance concerning Junk Dealers and etc." Said Ordinance #146 was read at length in open Council, the same having been passed its first reading Aug. 13<sup>th</sup> and was published in the Daily Sentinel the official paper Aug. 16<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1907, therupon Ald. Hudson made a motion seconded by Ald. Matthews that said Ordinance #146 be passed and adopted, upon call of roll vote was as follows, Ald. Davies yea, Drew yea, Boyer yea, Flynn yea, Hertz yea, Hudson yea, Matthews yea, Plank yea, motion carried.

Ord. #147 passed and adopted.  
 Ordinance #147, "An Ordinance concerning and regulating the speed of Bicycles, tricycles, velocipedes, automobiles, and other riding machines and etc." Said Ordinance #147 was read at length in open Council, the same having passed its first reading Aug. 13<sup>th</sup> and was published in the Daily Sentinel Aug. 15<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1907, therupon Ald. Flynn made a motion seconded by Ald. Boyer that said Ordinance #147 be passed and adopted, upon call of roll vote was as follows Ald. Davies yea, Drew yea, Boyer yea, Flynn yea, Hertz yea, Hudson yea, Matthews yea, Plank yea, motion carried.

Alderman Hertz introduced the following resolution.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the  
 City of Grand Junction, Colorado, that the judgement of Ida L. Anderson  
 vs the City of Grand Junction for \$1,750, now pending in the Supreme  
 Court of the State of Colorado, and the suit of Charles W. Anderson vs  
 The City of Grand Junction for \$8,000 now pending in the District Court  
 of Mesa County, Colorado, be settled and compromised by the payment  
 by the City of said judgement of \$1,750 and interest and cost of  
 both suits, and that a warrant be issued for the amount  
 of said judgement, interest and cost, by the City Clerk of  
 said City, upon the filing with said Clerk of a written  
 acceptance by Ida L. Anderson and Charles W. Anderson of the

terms of settlement of said suits, as specified in this resolution.

atty Wheeler for the plaintiffs stated that the costs of both suits would not exceed \$115<sup>00</sup> and the interest would be for one year at 8% thereupon Ald. Boyer made a motion seconded by Ald. Hudson that the resolution offered by Ald. Hertz be adopted on the basis made by atty Wheeler that the costs not exceed \$115<sup>00</sup> and the interest 8% for one year at 8%. upon call of roll vote was as follows. Ald. Davis nay, Drew nay, Boyer yea, Flynn nay, Hertz yea, Hudson yea, Matthews nay, Plank nay, motion lost.

Ald. Matthews made a motion seconded by Ald. Hudson that the mayor appoint a committee to confer further with the plaintiffs in the Anderson case vs the City of Grand Jct. and to settle on a net basis of \$1750.00 upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. Matthews made a motion seconded by Ald. Flynn to reconsider his former motion, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. Matthews made a motion seconded by Ald. Hudson that the mayor appoint a committee to be empowered to confer with the plaintiffs in the Anderson Case to effect a settlement if possible. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Wentworth appointed the following Committee. Ald. Matthews, Plank & Drew.

Ald. Drew informed the Council that warrant # 2590 drawn on the salary fund in his favor was destroyed by fire and that the same had not been registered by the City Treasurer. Thereupon Ald. Flynn made a motion seconded by Ald. <sup>Hudson</sup> Plank that the City Clerk be authorized to cancel said warrant #2590 and draw another warrant of in favor of A. P. Drew to cover his salary as alderman for the month of July A.D. 1907, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. Flynn made a motion seconded by Ald. Plank that the mayor be authorized to issue a Police Commission to John Davis to act as special Police without salary from the City, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. Hudson made a motion seconded by Ald. Matthews that the Chief of Police

Ald Matthews made a motion that the  
 water in the City ditches be turned off for thirty days.  
 no second to motion.
