W. A. Lynch & Co. presented an application for license to keep a saloon at the north 17<sup>th</sup> ft. of lots 29-30-31 & 32 in Block 117 in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, from Sep 15-1907 to April 17 1908 with authority to sell therein spirituous, vinous and malt liquors in quantities



less than one gallon, as provided by law; said application was accompanied by a petition signed by the owners of 10 lots in the south half of block 117, and said application was accompanied by a bond in the sum of \$2000.00 signed by the following ex. certifiers Wm. A. Lynch, T. E. Claisdell, W. F. White & A. D. Miller, Thereupon ald. Hudson made a motion seconded by ald. Drew that the application for license to keep a saloon at the north 17<sup>2</sup> foot of lots 29-30-31 & 32 in Block 117 in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, be granted to Wm. A. Lynch & Co. as petitioned for. ald. Hertz made an amendment seconded by ald. Plank that the application for license lay over for two weeks, upon call of roll on the amendment vote was as follows, ald.  meeting, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
