Resolution to  
cancel license  
of W. A. Lynch & Co

Whereas; In the opinion of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, the saloon license issued to Wm. A. Lynch and Co. Sept. 10th 1907 is illegal and void for the following reasons;

1st. It was issued while a license was out standing held by the same parties to conduct a saloon at the same place for the same identical period of time.

2nd. It was issued without the payment of any money to the City Treasurer and without the presentation of a duplicate Treasurer's receipt from the Treasurer as provided by the ordinances of this City.

3rd. The petition for said license was insufficient in law to justify the issuance of said license.

And Whereas, the Court has decided that the license issued to said Wm. A. Lynch & Co. June 13-1907 was illegal and void.

Therefore be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that the saloon license issued to said Wm. A. Lynch and Company September 10th, 1907 be and the same is hereby cancelled and the City Treasurer is hereby instructed to refund to said Wm. A. Lynch and Company for the ~~license~~ any balance remaining out of the amount paid by the said Wm. A. Lynch and Company for the license of June 13th 1907, after deducting a proportionate amount for the time said saloon has been open.

Thereupon Alderman Hertz made a motion



that said resolution be adopted, there was no second to his motion.

Resolution laid on table

Alderman Boyer made a motion seconded by Alderman Hudson that said resolution be laid on the table upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

A. P. Wharton dismissed from service

Alderman Flynn made a motion that night Policeman A. P. Wharton be dismissed from further service as Policeman, account of incompetency, and impitence, said motion was duly seconded by Alderman Matthews, upon call of motion the following voted aye, Aldermen Davies, Boyer, Flynn, Hertz, and Matthews, those voting nay Alderman Hudson, thereupon the presiding officer declared the motion carried.

A. L. Halligan appointed as night Police

Alderman Matthews placed in nomination A. L. Halligan for the position of night Police to fill the vacancy caused by the dismissal of A. P. Wharton, seconded by Alderman Hudson, upon roll call those voting aye were Aldermen Davies, Boyer, Flynn, Hertz, Hudson, and Matthews, those voting nay none, thereupon the presiding officer declared A. L. Halligan duly elected to fill the position of night Police.
