Pet for a sewer district to be formed

The following petition signed by J.W. Caldwell and 22 others was read and referred to the Water Sewers and Light Committee. We the undersigned citizens and taxpayers of the City of Grand Junction residing within the following described district respectfully ask of your honorable body to take the necessary steps and proceedings to establish and form a Sanitary Sewer District in and for the following described territory, to-wit:- All that territory within the said City lying between Hill Avenue on the South and North Avenue on the North; Seventh Street on the West and Twelfth Street on the east.

Alderman Plank made a motion seconded by Alderman Davies that the regular order of business be dispensed with, and Council proceed to take up the matter of selling to the highest bidder the proposed issue of \$50,000⁰⁰ Water Works ^{or other} bonds. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Said Bonds to be delivered to us in the following installments, \$20,000.00 as soon as approved by our Attorneys, \$15,000.00 thirty days after first delivery, and \$15,000.00 thirty days after second delivery, we to have the right to take up all or a larger amount earlier at our option.

Prior to our taking up and paying for said Bonds you are to furnish us a full Certified Transcript of the proceedings authorizing their issuance evidencing the legality and the purchase and all proceedings leading up to and culminating in the issue of these Bonds shall be subject to the approval of our Attorneys and you are to pass such additional or supplemental proceedings as our Attorneys require in order to secure their approving opinion.

We will mail you our Certified Check for \$1,000.00 which you are to hold until Bonds are delivered in accordance with the terms of this bid.
