

Grand Junction Colo. Feb. 25th 1908.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in regular session at the Council Chamber in the City Hall in said City on Tuesday, February 25th, 1908, at 8 P.M. pursuant to the rules of the Council.

Roll call

Upon roll call the following were present:
Mayor J. R. Wentworth,

Aldermen, W. D. Davis, A. P. Drew, W. C. Boyer, Matt A. Flynn, C. F. Hudson, and J. B. Matthews.

Absent aldermen Hertz and Plank.

Also present City Clerk, John M. Conley and City Attorney, Joe W. Rozzelle.

The minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Pet. for light on 11th Grand

A petition signed by 24 property owners for an arc light to be placed on the corner of 11th street and Grand ave was read and referred to the water & lights Com.

Pet. to open up street in Crawford add.

A petition signed by 46 citizens for Council to open up a street beginning at the north end of Chulouta ave and running north, intersecting with Ute and Colorado avenues, this was referred to the Street and alley Com.

Pet for walk on side White Pet. 12 + 13

A petition signed by 12 property owners located along the south side of White ave, between 12 + 13th sts requested that a sidewalk be ordered laid along said street. this was referred to the Street and alley Com.

Fire Chief Rec. purchase hose and team

Fire Chief Rogers recommended the purchase of 1000 ft of 2 1/2 in hose, and enough Anderson couplings to equip the best of our old hose, also the purchase of a team of horses, this was referred to the Fire and Police Com.

Bldg Condemned Lot 25 B. 96

Chairman Flynn of the Fire and Police Com. reported favorable and recommended that the Council condemn the house located on lot 25 Block 96 thereupon ald Boyer made a motion seconded by ald. Drew that the report of the Com. be accepted and affirmed upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Light Com. to locate lights

ald Hudson made a motion seconded by ald. Boyer that the Committee on water and lights be empowered to arrange for the location of the arc lamps

to be put in by the light Company, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Davies seconded by Flynn that the bills as read be allowed and warrants be drawn on Treasurer for same, upon call of roll the following voted aye Davies, Drew, Bayer, Flynn, Hudson and Matthews motion carried.

Ord. 149 called up

Thereupon Alderman Drew, called up and moved that there be placed upon its passage the following Ordinance which was introduced and read at the previous regular meeting of this Council held on February 11th, 1908, and published in The Daily Sentinel, the official newspaper of the City published and of general circulation in the City of Grand Junction on the 13th day of February, 1908.

An Ordinance

Providing for the issuance of bonds of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado for the purpose of construction of water works for said City for fire and domestic purposes.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado.

Section 1.

That bonds of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, in the principal sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) be issued for the purpose of the construction of water works for said City to supply said City and the inhabitants thereof with water for fire and domestic purposes as hereinafter provided.

Section 2.

Said bonds shall be issued in denominations of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) shall bear date of April 1st, 1908, shall be numbered from no. 1 to no. 50 inclusive, shall become due and payable in fifteen (15) years from their date, shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent (6) per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first day of April, and October of each year. The several installments of interest shall be evidenced by interest coupons attached to said bonds, and both principal and interest shall be payable as they shall become due in lawful money of the United States of America, at the Banking House of Kountz Bros. in New York City, in the State of New York.

Section 3.

Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Treasurer of said City and shall be

attested by the City Clerk, shall have the corporate seal of said City affixed thereto and shall be executed in substantially the following form to-wit:

Water Works Bond.

Know all men by these presents that the City of Grand Junction in the County of Mesa and State of Colorado is indebted to and promises to pay the bearer One Thousand Dollars in lawful money of the United States of America, on the first day of April A. D. 1923 with interest thereon at the rate of Six (6) per Cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October of each year, upon the presentation and surrender of the proper coupons hereto annexed signed by lithographed signature of the City Clerk. Both principal and interest of this bond are payable at the banking house of Kountz Bros. in the City of New York in the State of New York.

And the said City is hereby held and firmly bound, and its faith and credit, and all the real and personal property in said City are hereby pledged for the prompt payment of this bond and the interest thereon at maturity.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of like date, tenor and amount, issued by said City for the purpose of the construction of water works for said City for fire and domestic purposes.

Under and by authority of and in accordance with the provisions of an Ordinance legally passed by the City Council of said City on the 25th, day of February A. D. 1908. and by authority of an act of the general assembly of the State of Colorado entitled "an Act relating to Municipal Corporations" approved April 4th, 1877, as amended and supplemented. And it is hereby certified, recited and declared that all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution and laws of Colorado, precedent to and in the issuance of this bond and others of the same series, have been properly done, happened and performed and do exist in regular and due form as required by said Constitution and Laws, and that the indebtedness of said City, including this series of bonds does not exceed any limitation prescribed by the Constitution and Statutes of said State of Colorado.

In testimony whereof, said City, by its Council,

has caused this bond to be signed by the Mayor and the Treasurer and attested by the Clerk of said City and the Corporate seal of said City to be hereto affixed, and this bond to be dated the First day of April A. D. 1908.

That the interest coupons attached to said bonds shall be executed in substantially the following form to wit:

On the first day of _____ 19____ the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, will pay the Bearer, Thirty (\$30) Dollars in lawful money of the United States of America at the Banking House of Kountz Bros, in the City of New York in the State of New York, being six months interest on its Water Works bond No. _____ and dated April 1, 1908.

City Clerk.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the City Council annually at the time and in the manner fixed by law for levying other City taxes, to levy a special tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds; and it shall further be the duty of the City Council to annually levy an additional special tax for the purpose of creating a sinking fund for the payment of the principal of said bonds at maturity, which amounts so annually levied, for interest and sinking fund shall be Six Thousand Three Hundred and Thirty Three and $\frac{33}{100}$ Dollars, and such taxes when collected shall be preserved for and applied only to the payment of the interest and the principal of said bonds as herein provided and specified.

Section 5. The amount that shall be received from the issue and sale of said bonds is hereby appropriated for, and shall be applied to, the construction of water works for said City of Grand Junction and to no other purpose.

Section 6. This ordinance is hereby made irrevocable until the indebtedness herein provided for shall have been fully paid and discharged.

On motion the said ordinance was numbered 149 and ordered published in the official newspaper of the City according to law.
