Street Advertising
Posts

The Western Street Sign Directory Co.
of this City present the following for your consideration;

Said Company desires to present said City of Grand Junction with fifty (50) iron street sign directory posts, as per model and to erect same on the principal street corners in accordance with instructions of the City Engineer;

said posts to extend eight and one half (8½) feet above ground and to be set two and one half feet in concrete, posts to taper from three (3) inches

inches at base to one (1) inch at top. The street signs to measure three and three quarter ($3\frac{3}{4}$) inches in width by sixteen (16) inches in length, advertising space to measure twelve (12) inches in width by fourteen (14) in length approximately. Posts to be painted black; the signs in black and bronze or aluminum; said fifty (50) posts, and as many more as the Company may erect, will be maintained in good condition by said Company for five years for the privilege of using advertising space on said posts for as many years, and with the right to renew said contract at its expiration.

Upon the failure of said Company to maintain posts in good condition, they agree to forfeit their right to use advertising space on said posts.

Any suggestions from those concerned will be willingly considered.

To which publisher's affidavit of publication was attached an exact printed copy of such notice; said affidavit being made by J. N. Gwitting as publisher of the Daily Sentinel, a daily newspaper of general circulation published in the said City of Grand Junction and showing the publication of the said notice in the said daily newspaper for each and every day beginning on May 25, 1908, and ending on June 9, 1908, inclusive, which was read.

Alderman Drew moved, seconded by Alderman Hudson that the said affidavit of publication be placed on file.

The Clerk called the roll of aldermen upon this motion, and the aldermen each, upon his name being called, voted as follows: - Drew yea, Boyer yea, Flynn yea, Hertz yea, Hudson yea, Matthew yea, Plank yea.

All of the aldermen voting yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and ordered said proof of publication to be placed on file.

Alderman Drew then introduced the Ordinance referred to in the above mentioned published notice and entitled,

"An Ordinance

Granting to Horace K. Devereux and Eugene A. Sunderlin, their heirs and assigns, the right, privilege and franchise to erect, construct, operate and maintain a street railway on certain streets, avenues, alleys and public places of and within the City of Grand Junction, and to use the same for such street railway purposes;"

And the same was read in full.

Alderman Hertz moved, that the Ordinance lay over until next regular meeting, seconded by Alderman Boyer thereupon the Mayor ruled that the motion was out of order.

Alderman Boyer moved, seconded by Alderman Hudson that the Clerk be and he hereby is ordered to cause to be published daily in the Daily Sentinel a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Grand Junction, for a period of two weeks, the said Ordinance entitled,

"An Ordinance

Granting to Horace K. Devereux and Eugene A. Sunderlin, their heirs and assigns, the right, privilege and franchise to erect, construct, operate and maintain a

Street railway on certain streets, avenues, alleys and public places of and within the City of Grand Junction, and to use the same for such street railway purposes."

The Clerk called the roll of alderman upon this motion, and the alderman each, upon his name being called voted as follows: - Drew nay, Boyer yea, Flynn nay, Hertz nay, Hudson yea, Matthews yea, Plank nay.
