The City Council of the City of Grand Junction Colo met in regular session at the Council Chamber in the City Hall in said City on Tuesday Aug 11<sup>th</sup> at the hour of 8 P. M. Pursuant to the rules of the Council.

Upon roll call the following responded present: Mayor J. R. Wentworth, Aldermen<sup>r</sup> Boyer M. A. Flynn, M. Hutch, C. F. Hudson, J. B. Matthews, J. C. Bank, City Clerk Proteus Leon J. Chapman and City Attorney Joe W. Roggelle.

Roll Call

The minutes of the meeting held July 28<sup>th</sup> were read and approved.

Road Petition  
Sect 11  
1/2 City 1/2 County

A petition for a road beginning at the East quarter corner of Section 11 in Tps. 1 S of R. 1 W of the U. P. M. and running thence West to the intersection with the County Road at or near the center of said Section 11, a distance of one half mile. The petition was signed by C. E. Cherrington, C. E. Udelski, Wm. Weiser, E. P. Schellenberger, A. G. Taylor, J. C. Stanford, J. S. O'Neil, Ed. Madson, W. G. Strubbe and A. L. Davis. This petition was acted favorably upon by the Board of County Commissioners, and was referred to the Street and Alley Committee by Mayor Wentworth for investigation.

The ~~Street and Alley~~ Committee reported unfavorably on the petition of Wm County to erect an addition at the rear of 317 South Second Street.

Moved by Alderman Matthews seconded by Alderman Hudson, the report of the ~~Street and Alley~~ <sup>Fire & Police</sup> Com. be accepted as read. Motion carried and was so declared by the Mayor.

Elite Laundry to  
add 12ft to  
Smoke stack

Alderman Flynn of the Fire and Police Committee made a verbal report on the smoke stack at the Elite Laundry and stated the proprietor would at once place a 12 foot galvanized iron stack on the chimney which would overcome the objection made by residents of other portions of the city.

Moved by Alderman Hudson, seconded by Alderman Matthews, the report of the Chairman of the Fire and Police Committee be sustained. The motion carried and was so declared by the Mayor.

Sidewalks ordered  
laid

The Street and Alley Committee recommended that sidewalks be ordered as follows. East side of 8th street between Reed and White. West side of Second street from Main to Alley. Also that the city put in walks on west side of Cottonwood Park with crossing on 4th street to connect with above.

Moved by Alderman Plant seconded by Alderman Flynn, the report of the Street and Alley Committee be accepted and the proposed walks ordered laid. Upon call for vote the following Aldermen voted Yes. Boyer, Flynn, Hertz, Hudson, Matthews, Plant. The Mayor declared the motion carried unanimously.

The Water Committee reported on the agreement between the D & R R R. & the City. The following resolution was introduced by M. Hertz. Resolved that the contract proposed by the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad Co. for a right of way for a pipe line over the rights of way of said Railroad Company at mile post 422 plus 491.7 feet of said Railroad Company mileage in S.W. quarter section 26 T. 15 N and 1 W of the 11th P. M. in Mesa County Colorado, bearing date of the \_\_\_\_\_ day of July A. D. 1908 be accepted and the Mayor is hereby authorized and instructed to sign said contract and the City Clerk is authorized and instructed to affix the seal of the City. Moved by Alderman Matthews, seconded by Alderman Hudson, the resolution be adopted. Upon call for vote the following voted Yes. Boyer, Flynn, Hertz, Hudson, Matthews, Plant.

Whereas said licensee has not complied with the Ordinance regulating his avocation. Therefore be it resolved that the license heretofore granted to said Mert Ketchum and all authority to act thereunder be hereby revoked.

Alderman Boyer made a motion, seconded by Alderman Hudson, that the resolution be adopted and the license revoked. Upon call for vote the following Aldermen voted yea. Boyer, Flynn, Hertz, Hudson, Matthews, Plant. The Mayor thereupon declared the motion carried.

Quarantine

Alderman Matthews made a motion seconded by Alderman Boyer, that the services of the special quarantine officer be dispensed with and the office discontinued. Upon call for vote the Aldermen present voted as follows. Boyer, yea, Flynn, yea, Hertz, yea, Hudson, Nay, Matthews, yea, Plant, yea. The Mayor thereupon declared the motion duly carried.

There being no objections the Mayor referred back to the reports of Standing Committee.

Bid for addition  
to rear of Fire  
Hall awarded  
to C. L. Hawkins

Alderman Matthews of the Purchasing Committee reported that he had received bid for the erection of a building at the rear of the Fire Station.

Upon motion which duly carried the bids were opened and were as follows. Bid of Polker and Johnson for concrete work for Addition to Fire House \$109<sup>00</sup>. Bid of C. L. Hawkins for complete addition to Fire House according to plan and specifications \$555<sup>00</sup>.

The following Resolution was then introduced by Alderman Hudson.

"Be it resolved that the bid submitted by C. L. Hawkins for the construction of an addition to the City Fire House, for the sum of \$555<sup>00</sup> bearing date of Aug. 11<sup>th</sup> 1908 be accepted and the Mayor is hereby authorized and instructed to execute a contract with said C. L. Hawkins for the construction of said addition pursuant to the plans and

specifications thereof.

Moved by Alderman Flynn, seconded by Alderman Plant that the Resolution as read be adopted. Upon call for vote the following Aldermen voted Yea. Boyer, Flynn, Hertz, Hudson, Matthews, Plant. The Mayor thereupon declared the motion carried.

Alderman Matthews moved, seconded by Alderman Hudson, that the Mayor employ J.B. Boyer, architect, to superintend construction of the additions to the Fire House. Upon call for vote the following Aldermen voted Yea Boyer, Flynn, Hertz, Hudson, Matthews, Plant. The motion was declared carried.

Old pound sold

Alderman Matthews of the Purchasing Committee reported that he had sold the Old Pound to the highest bidder for the sum of \$14<sup>00</sup> & same had been turned into the City Treas.
