To the mayor and Council;

Report of opl. Com on Charter Convantine

herewith submit our report on the question of the petition presented to this council asking for a special election to be held on april the 6th 1909 Submitting the quistion of a Charter Committee to a vote of the voters of said City; and also requising this council to pass an ordinars calling for said election.

voters of the Ceity have signed this petition asking that this election be held we deem it proper to submit the justion to the voters of said city and while your committee consider it an unnecessary expense to introduce this ordinance above referred to and publish same still we believe that the extra precantion of having the matter properly before the people by passing this Ordinance well justify the expense attached thereto.

that we are opposed to a charter convention and do not endorse the introduction of said petition in any manner and submit therefor the following reasons:

the people it will require at least three elections, one to be held on april the 6th, and if voted upon favorably another to be held for the election of twenty one tap payers to frame a charter and a third to be held that the people may adopt or reject the charter as framed by said members.

the said Charter be rejected then within thirty days theraster twenty and members of a new charter convention shall be elected at a special election to be called as abore in said city and they shall proceed as above to from a charter, which shall in like manner and to the

like and be published and submitted to a vote of said voters for their approval or rejection. If again rejected the procedure herein designated shall be repeated (each special election for members of a new charter communition, being within thirty days after each registion) until a charter is finally approved by a majority by those voting therion.

It would seem to your committee that the expense attached to this Charter convention, if adopted, would be approximately

Twenty Thousand Dollars.

Third - It would also seem to your committee that inasmuch as there are a great many matters of vital interest to this community that will be brought up within the next twelve months that this question of a Charter Convention, which can be adopted at any time afon thirty days notice should be allowed to rest for at least that length of time and a Council be elected at the spring election by the people incorporated by the idea that there is a possibility of their offices being merged into a commission form of government.

Tourth - your committee also desires to report that

they consider the expense attached to the adoption of a charter form of government would be very large and would materially increase the rate of taxation and with a very probable chance of the present

form of minicipal government remaining unchanged.

Fifth -- your committee also desires to state that at has looked into the article of the constitution which is anthouty for this election and can find no reference in the title of the act wherein the cities of the first and seemd clase are referred to and your committee firmly believe that in so much as the body of said act refers to cities of the State of Colorado other then the bity and County of Dervar that said act is unconstitutional and an election hold thereunder could be of no force and effect.
