

Grand Junction, Colo. March 23, 1909

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at the Council Chambers in the City Hall in said City at the hour of 8 P.M. pursuant to the rules of the Council. Mayor Wentworth presiding, upon roll call the following responded present: aldermen W. A. Davies, A. P. Drew, W. C. Bayer, J. B. Matthews and J. C. Plank. also present City atty Joe W. Rozelle. alderman M. Hertz and C. T. Hudson arrived a few minutes late. absent alderman M. H. Flynn.

The minutes of the meetings held March 9 and 16 were read and approved.

Wm Connelly Pet.
for Permit

Wm Connelly made application for a permit to
brick veneer his house located at 319 So 2nd street and to build an addition
to same. this was referred to the Fire & Police committee.

A petition to reconsider the appointment of
election judges was upon motion duly carried laid over until later in
the meeting.

The Street & Valley Com. reported favorable upon the
sidewalks ordered petition to order sidewalks laid along the north side of block 129.
laid
therupon alderman Drew made a motion seconded by alderman Plank
that the report of the committee be accepted and the sidewalks be
ordered laid, upon call of roll the following voted yea Aldermen
W.W. Davies, A.P. Drew, W.C. Boyar, M. Hertz, C.T. Hudson, J.B. Matthews and
J.C. Plank. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

Water Sewer and Light Com. reported
Water mains favorable upon the petition for water main to be laid on Belford ave
ordered laid on from fifth to third streets. Alderman Plank made a motion seconded
Belford ave by alderman Matthews that the report of the committee be accepted

Hudson yea. Matthews nay, Plank nay motion carried. Lost.

Chief of Police O'Neil requested Council to
place red lights at certain locations in the streets in order to
notify the night Police when a call is made for them. this was
referred to the Fire & Police Com.

F.O. Ray Engaged
for paving on
streets

City Engineer O'Malley received a telegram
from F.O. Ray a Civil Engineer at Colo. Springs stating that he would
come here for consultation in regard to street paving for the sum
of \$100.00 and expenses. Therupon ald. Plank made a motion
seconded by ald. Matthews that the Council accept the offer made
by F.O. Ray. upon call of roll the following voted yea. Aldermen
Davies, Drew, Boyar, Hertz, Hudson, Matthews and Plank motion carried.

The following Ordinance was read in full by the Clerk, an Ordinance entitled, "Ordinance No - annual appropriation Ordinance of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, provides for the expenses of the City of Grand Junction for the fiscal year beginning April 1st A. D. 1910, and ending March 31st 1910." etc -
 1st Passed.

Thereupon Alderman Drew moved seconded by Alderman Plank, that the ordinance as read do now pass.

The vote being called for, a roll call was ordered, and each alderman, as his name was called, voted as follows: Alderman W. A. Davies yea. A. P. Drew yea. W. C. Boyer yea. M. Hertz yea. C. T. Hudson yea. J. B. Matthews yea. J. C. Plank yea. A majority of the aldermen having voted in favor of the motion, the mayor declared the motion carried, and the ordinance duly passed.

Ald. Matthews made a motion seconded by Ald. Hudson that said ordinance be numbered 157 upon call of motion. Said motion carried unanimously.

The following Ordinance was read in full by the Clerk the same being the second reading of said Ordinance an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance
 Salary Ordinance establishing the Compensation and Salaries of City Officers." etc
 Passed

City Atty. Rozzelle introduced a resolution to amend said ordinance so it would read Aldermen each \$20.00 per month payable monthly. Ald. Matthews made a motion seconded by Ald. Plank to adopt said resolution to amend said ordinance upon call of roll vote was as follows: Aldermen Davies yea. Drew may. Boyer may. Hertz may. Hudson may. Matthews yea. Plank yea. motion lost.

Whereupon it was moved by Alderman Drew seconded by Alderman Hudson that the ordinance as read do now pass. The vote being called for, a roll call was ordered, and each alderman, as his name was called, voted as follows:

Alderman W. A. Davies yea. A. P. Drew yea. W. C. Boyer yea. M. Hertz yea. C. T. Hudson yea. J. B. Matthews yea. J. C. Plank yea. A majority of the aldermen having voted in favor of the motion, the mayor declared the motion carried, and the ordinance duly passed.

motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald Davies moved to adjourn seconded by
ald. Drew, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
