Roll call
The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chambers in the City Hall in said city at the hour of 8 Pm pursuant to the rules of the Council. Mayor Wentworth presiding, upon roll call the following responded present: aldermen W. D. Caries, A. P. Drew, W. C. Bayer, J. B. Matthews and J. C. Plank. also present city atty Joe W. Rozzelle. aldermen M. Hertz and C. F. Hudson arrived a few minutes late. absent alderman M. H. Lynn.

The minutes of the meetings held March 9 and 16 were read and approved.

Wm Conerty made application for a permit to erect Vener his house located at 317 So 2nd Street and to build an addition to same. this was referred to the Fire Police committee.

The following Ordinance was read in full by the Clerk, an Ordinance entitled, Ordinance no - "annual appropriation Ordinance of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, provides for the Expenses of the City of Grand Junction for the fiscal year beginning April 1st a. d. 1909, and ending March 31st 1910. etc -
