Alderman Drew presented to the Council a Publisher's affidavit of Publication of the notice of Horace K. Devreux and Eugene A. Sunderlin of their intention to apply to the City Council of the City of Grand Junction at this meeting for the passage of an Ordinance entitled:

"An Ordinance to Amend an Ordinance entitled, 'An Ordinance No 152 granting to Horace K. Devreux and Eugene A. Sunderlin, Their Heir and assigns, the Right, Privilege and Franchise to erect, Construct, Operate and Maintain a Street Railway on Certain Streets, Avenues, Alleys and Public Places of and Within the City of Grand Junction, and to use the same for such street Railway Purposes.' to which Publisher's affidavit of publication was attached an exact printed copy of such notice, said affidavit being made by J. N. Bunting as Editor of the Daily Sentinel, a daily newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Grand Junction, showing the publication of said notice in said daily newspaper for each and every issue thereof beginning on March 15<sup>th</sup> 1909 and ending on April 13, 1909 inclusive. which was read.

Alderman Drew moved, seconded by Alderman Plank that the said notice and affidavit of publication be approved and placed on file. The Clerk called the roll of Alderman upon this motion and the aldermen each upon their names being called, voted as follows: W. D. Davis yea, A. P. Drew yea, W. G. Boyer yea, M. H. Flynn yea, M. Hertz yea, C. F. Hudson yea, J. B. Matthews yea, J. G. Plank yea. Each alderman voting yea, the mayor declared the motion carried and the notice and affidavit were ordered placed on file.

Alderman Drew presented to the Council the written consents of the property owners abutting on the following described portions of streets and avenues in the City of Grand Junction,

to-wit: "Second Street from north line of Pittkin Avenue to the east line of the lands of the A. & R. G. Ry. Co.; South Avenue between Third Street and the east line of the A. & R. G. Ry. Co.; and between the West Line of Eleventh Street and the east line of Twelfth Street; and on Twelfth Street between the north line of Pittkin Avenue and the south city limits; and on Ninth Street between South Avenue and South City granted RR Co. limits, and on Fifth Street between South Avenue and a point at right angles with the south line of Block 16, as shown in the original plat of the townsite of the City of Grand Junction." and therewith presented a certificate of the City Engineer certifying that said consents were signed by the owners of the land representing more than one half of the frontage on said portions of said streets and avenues as set forth and described in said notice and consent.

Alderman Drew moved. Seconded by Alderman Matthews that said consents and City Engineer's Certificate be received, approved and placed on file.

The Clerk called the roll of aldermen upon this motion and the aldermen each, upon their names being called, voted as follows: Davies yea. Drew yea. Boyan yea. Flynn yea. Hertz yea. Hudson yea. Matthews yea. Plank yea. Each alderman voting yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and ordered the consents and Engineer's certificate placed on record.

Alderman Drew then introduced the Ordinance referred to in the above mentioned published notice and entitled:

An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance Street Railway entitled "An Ordinance No. 152 granting to Horace K. Devreny and Franklin Ordinance Eugene A. Sundelin, their heirs and assigns, the right, privilege to amend Ord. 152 passed first reading and franchise to erect, construct, operate and maintain a street railway on certain streets, avenues, alleys and public places of and within the City of Grand Junction, and to use the same for such street railway purposes". passed July 17, 1908, and approved July 21, 1908. And the same was read in full.

Alderman Drew moved. Seconded by Alderman Hertz that the Clerk Mr. and he in hereby ordered, to cause to be published in the Daily Sentinel a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Grand Junction for a period of two weeks, said ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance entitled 'An Ordinance No. 152 granting to Horace K. Devreny and Eugene A. Sundelin, their heirs and assigns, the right, privilege and franchise to erect, construct,

operate and maintain a street railway on certain streets, avenues, alleys and public places of and within the City of Grand Junction, and to use the same for such street railway purposes," passed July 17, 1908, and approved July 21, 1908.

The Clerk called the roll of aldermen upon this motion and the aldermen each, upon their name being called, voted as follows: Davis yes. Drew yes. Bayar yes. Flynn yes. Hertz yes. Hudoon yes. Matthews yes. Plunk yes. Each alderman voting yes the mayor declared the motion carried and added the ordinance so published. \*

Alderman Drew introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption.

#### Resolution.

Whereas a Survey and the plat thereof of a certain portion of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, known as the Second Division Resurvey was approved by the City Council of said city at a meeting thereof under date of April 1907 and which said resurvey has proven to be incorrect and not in accord with the original Survey made by the Grand Junction Town and Development Company's Survey defining the boundary of Pitkin and South Moore in said City, and has been succeeded by a second resurvey, known and designated as the second division resurvey as amended, which said Survey with the plat thereof was duly accepted by said council at a meeting thereof under date of January 12th, 1909, and

Whereas as a result of said original second division resurvey a number of buildings have been, on account of said survey being in error, placed beyond the line of said Pitkin and South Avenue.

Now therefore be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that Pitkin Avenue between the east line of Sixth street and the west line of Seventh Street be and the same is hereby declared to be 76.36 feet wide and that the north line of said street or avenue is twenty feet north of the street monument of said avenue and that the south line of said street is 56.36 feet south of said monument line and that South Avenue in said City between the east line of Fifth street and the west line of Seventh street be and the same is hereby declared to be 74.73 feet wide and that the north line of said avenue is 20 feet north of street monument line of said avenue and the south line of said avenue is 54.73 feet south of said monument line, and

Be it further resolved that John R. Wentworth, Mayor of said City, or his successor in office is hereby authorized and empowered to sign, execute, acknowledge and deliver a quit claim deed in and to all that portion of Lathin Avenue lying without the Boundary line last above mentioned and described to the several property owners owning property along said Lathin and South avenues in said City who have through inadvertence or mistake on account of the error in the original Second Division Survey encroached upon said street and that John M. Conley, City Clerk of said City, or his successor is hereby authorized to duly attest the execution of said deeds and affix the seal of said City thereto in testimony thereof.

Alderman Drew introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption.

#### Resolution.

Whereas Thomas B. Crawford as Commissioner hitherto duly appointed to make, execute, acknowledge and deliver deeds of conveyance for lots belonging to the town of Grand Junction, and,

Whereas, the said Thomas B. Crawford as such Commissioner and Charles F. Shanks as mayor of the Town of Grand Junction, aforesaid, on March 16, 1883, made and executed a conveyance to lots 6 and 10 and half of 11, 15, 17 to 23 inclusive, 25, 26, 27, 31 and 32 in Block 11 in the town of Grand Junction and other property, and the said deed was duly attested and the seal of said Town affixed thereto by P. H. Westmonland, as Clerk of said Town, and the deed was duly acknowledged by the said Thomas B. Crawford, Charles F. Shanks, and P. H. Westmonland as such officers respectively, before J. W. Basden, Justice of the peace in and for the County of Mesa, in the State of Colorado, whereby the said Town of Grand Junction conveyed the aforesaid lots and parts of lots to the Grand Junction Town Company. and

Whereas, it was intended to convey

the whole of each and every one of said lots except the east one half of lot 11, and

Whereas, manifest error appears in the description of the lots numbered 15, 17 to 23 inclusive, 25, 26, 27, 31 and 32 in Block 117 in the Town of Grand Junction, aforesaid, as contained in said deed, and

whereas, said property has been sold and conveyed to divers persons who are interested in the correction of said description and it appears just and proper that the said correction should be made, and

Whereas, A. P. Drew is now the owner of lots 20 and 21 in block 117 aforesaid and is entitled to a correction in the description of said lots 20 and 21 in the said deed of the Commissioner and Mayor dated March 16, 1883.

Therefore be it resolved: That the said Thomas B. Crawford as said Commissioner and John R. Wentworth, or his successor in said office, as mayor of the City of Grand Junction (successor to all the property, franchises, rights and interests of the Town of Grand Junction, aforesaid) are hereby authorized and empowered to sign, execute, acknowledge and deliver a quit claim deed in and to lots 20 and 21 in Block 117 in the Town of Grand Junction to said A. P. Drew, and John M. Conley, or his successor in said office, as the Clerk of said City of Grand Junction is hereby authorized to duly attest the execution of said deed and affix the seal of the said city thereto in testimony thereof.

Said resolution was duly seconded by Ald. Plank upon call of roll vote was as follows, Alderman Davies <sup>yea</sup>, Drew <sup>yea</sup>, Flynn <sup>yea</sup>, Bayar <sup>yea</sup>, Hertz <sup>yea</sup>, Hudson <sup>yea</sup>, Matthew <sup>yea</sup>, Plank <sup>yea</sup> motion carried.

The applications for liquor licenses were approved by aldermen Hertz and Davies of the license committee whereupon Ald. Hudson made a motion seconded by Ald. Hertz that the report of said license committee be accepted and that the licenses be granted, upon call of roll vote was as follows alderman Davies <sup>yea</sup>, Drew <sup>nay</sup>, Bayar <sup>nay</sup>, Flynn <sup>yea</sup>, Hertz <sup>yea</sup>, Hudson <sup>yea</sup>, Matthew <sup>nay</sup>, Plank <sup>nay</sup>, the vote being four yeas and four nays which was a tie the mayor declared the motion lost.

Result of City election of city officers and other questions submitted at the election held April 6th, 1909 resulted as follows: For mayor April 6, 1909 James H. Lee, City Clerk H. F. Vortek, City Treasurer Leon J. Chapman, alderman First Ward J. A. Waldron and Chas. Gasho, alderman Second Ward, C. P. M. Cary and Charles Berryberry, aldermen Third Ward A. B. Campbell and R. L. Magill, aldermen Fourth Ward A. P. Drew and W. H. Holman for refunding of \$65,000.00 water bonds carried by 321 For Charter Convention carried by 426. Ald. Plank introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption.

X Resolution

Whereas, at the last City election, held on the 6th, day of April, 1909, by a vote of the qualified electors of the City of Grand Junction, this City was authorized to refund its water bonds in the amount of \$65,000 by the issue of \$65,000

Orson Adams of 59-10-20 refunding water bonds, and

price \$65,000.00

Whereas, Orson Adams, of Grand Junction, Colorado, has bid for said issue of refunding bonds the price of par, and accrued interest, together with a bonus of \$258<sup>69</sup>, the interest on said bonds shall be paid semi-annually at the office of the City Treasurer in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, or at the fiscal agency of the City within the City of New York, said bonds to be dated not later than May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1909, and has further offered as part of said bid, to furnish the City blank forms for said bonds, and for all necessary procedure to be taken by the City Council, and

Whereas, it is a part of said bid that the City Council, as a requirement on its part, shall furnish said Orson Adams, or his assigns, with certified copies of all proceedings heretofore taken in connection with said refunding bond issue by the City, and that said bid is made subject to the approval of his attorney of the legality of the proceedings had by the City in authorizing and issuing said bonds, all further proceedings relative to the issue of said refunding bonds be done under the direction of his attorney, whose services shall be paid for by said Adams, and

Whereas, the proposal of said Adams to purchase said bonds is the best and highest bid made therefore, and it is for the best interests of the City of Grand Junction

to accept the same.

Now therifor be it resolved that the mayor and other officers of the City of Grand Junction be instructed to perform all the duties required of them under said proposal and bid, and to sign and execute the said bonds in such denominations as are directed by law without expense to said Adams or his assigns, and to deliver said bonds to him upon the payment of said sum of money at Grand Junction, Colorado, without expense to him, and

Be it further resolved, that in the event that the attorney for the said Adams refuses to certify to the legality of said bonds, then said Adams shall be fully released from all obligation under his proposal and bid, and his certified check for \$1,000, tendered with and as a part of his bid, shall be returned by the City to him at once.

The above motion was duly seconded by alderman Matthews, and on motion it was carried by the following vote: alderman W. D. Davies yea. A. P. Drew yea. W. C. Bayar yea. M. H. Flynn yea. M. Heitz yea. C. F. Hudson yea. J. B. Matthews yea. J. G. Plank yea.
