Alderman Hudson introduced the following resolution.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, that the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars be paid to Joe W. Rozzalle as the balance of compensation due him for revision of the ordinances of the said city, said Rozzalle to do whatever may be necessary towards completion of said work at such time as the Council of said city may designate.

Alderman Plank moved, seconded by Alderman Hudson that said resolution be passed and adopted, upon call of roll vote was as follows: Alderman Davis yea, Hertz yea, Hudson yea, Matthews yea, Plank yea. a majority of the Council having voted in favor of the motion, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the said resolution passed and adopted.

Alderman Hudson made a motion seconded by Alderman Matthews that Frank Parks be paid by City Warrant the sum of Ten Dollars to reimburse him for the amount he paid said city for calves that were placed in the City Council and sold at Public auction by the Chief of Police under a state law that was obsolete and the rightful owner of said calves later recovered them from Frank Parks without compensation to said Parks. Upon call of roll vote was as follows. Alderman Davis yea, Hertz yea, Hudson yea, Matthews yea, Plank yea. motion carried.
