

Grand Junction Colo. June 22nd 1909

The City Council convened in a regular session this evening at 8 o'clock P.M. Mayor Lee presiding.

The Clerk called the roll, to which the following responded as present.

The committee consisting of Water Supt. Vedder and Ald. Holman who had been instructed to go to Aspen to investigate second hand Boilers suitable for use of Water works reported, that figures had been submitted by the Mines & Smelter supply Co. on a suitable new Boiler, which would be about as cheap as the buying of second hand Boiler for sale in Aspen.

Gasho that Water Supt. and City Clerk be instructed to order from The Mines & Smelter Supply Co. a new Boiler at a cost of \$835.00 as per specifications submitted by said Company. Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that Leon. J. Chapman, the Treasurer of said city be and he is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to apply the proceeds of the sale of the issue of \$65,000. of the Refunding Bonds of said city, to be issued and sold under and by virtue of the provisions of Ordinance

Resolution directing Treasurer to call in Bonds and apply proceeds of Refunding Bonds in payment of same.

No. 164 of said city, passed, adopted and approved the 22nd day of June A.D. 1909, to the purchase and payment of the Bonds of the said city, issued and sold under and by virtue of Ordinance No. 58 passed and adopted the 24th day of April A.D. 1897, which said Bonds are dated May 1st 1897, and are payable at the option of the said city; and

Be it further Resolved, that the said Leon J. Chapman, treasurer of said city, he and he is hereby authorized and directed to call in and pay all of said Bonds, being bonds numbered from 1 to 65 both inclusive, and to cause to be published in the Daily News, a newspaper published in said city, and heretofore designated as the official paper thereof, a notice, that said city bonds, by numbers and amount, will be paid upon presentation, and that at the expiration of thirty days from the date of the first publication of said notice, said bonds will cease to draw interest.
