

Grand Junction July 13th 1909

The City Council convened in regular session this evening at 8 o'clock, Mayor Lee presiding.

Roll call

The clerk called the roll, to which the following Aldermen answered as present.

Pet. of C.C. O'Neil

Petition by C. C. O'Neil was read praying council to grant for Police Commissioner a commission as Special Policeman. Referred to committee on Fire & Police.

Pet. of Crystal Theatre to put electric sign in front of theatre

A petition signed by Gilman & Co. praying permission from council to place an electric sign in front of the Crystal theatre, to extend three feet from said building, perpendicular in form, and at least nine feet above sidewalk.

Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction:

That the city lease from the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad Company, for a term of one year, commencing July 1st 1909 and ending June 30th 1910, at a rental of one (\$1.00) dollar per annum, the premises heretofore and now occupied by the said City of Grand Junction as a dwelling for the Pumpier at the City Pumping Plant, which premises are more fully described as follows:

Commencing at a point thirty (30) feet northeasterly at right angles from the center line of the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad company's main track in the southwest quarter (SW 1/4) of section twenty six (26), township one (1) south of Range one (1) west of the Ute Meridian, said point being four hundred and fifty nine (459) feet northwesterly, measured along said main track from mile post Four twenty two (422) of said Railroad company's mileage, thence northwesterly parallel with and thirty (30) feet from said center line of main track, twenty five (25) feet,

thence ninety degrees (90) right twenty two (22) feet -;
 thence ninety degrees (90) right twenty five (25) feet -;
 thence ninety degrees (90) right twenty two (22) feet -
 to the place of beginning.

Be it further Resolved:

that James H. Lee, Mayor of said city be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in duplicate ~~in duplicate~~ on behalf of the city as lessee, a lease for the above described property for the term of one year at the annual rental of one dollar to the above said lessor, which said lease shall contain such other reasonable and just provisions regarding the use of the property as may be prescribed by said lessor; and that W. F. Forbes City Clerk of said city, shall attest said lease and affix the corporate seal of said city thereto. Moved by Ald. Gasho, and seconded by Ald. Magill that resolution as read be adopted.
