A Communication was read from E. C. Rand, relative to certain street crossings at South and Eleventh streets on Main. Officer J. McCue submitted a written report stating the number of Arc lights out of service during June & July, eleven and nineteen respectively.

Upon motion of Alderman Gasho, the Council voted to adjourn.
