

Grand Junction Sept. 14<sup>th</sup> 1909

The City Council convened <sup>this evening</sup> regular session at 8 o'clock P.M. Mayor Lee presiding.

Upon call of roll the following responded as present:

Roll Call Campbell; Derryberry; Gasho; Holman; M<sup>c</sup> Cary; Magill.

The minutes of last regular meeting were read by the Minutes approved Clerk, and approved.

Dr. W.R. Bull in behalf of the School Board submitted a proposition that J.J. Allison act jointly as City Policeman and Tenant-officer, and a salary of 75<sup>00</sup> per month to be paid half each: 37<sup>50</sup> by the School Board, and 37<sup>50</sup> by the city.

Tenant-Officer Allison to act as Mounted Police Moved by Ald. Gasho, and seconded by Ald. M<sup>c</sup> Cary that proposition be accepted.

The motion being put, the clerk called the roll, whereupon, each Alderman as his name was called voted as follows.

Resolution.

Resolution relating to Main St. Bridge

Whereas the Seventeenth General Assembly of the State of Colorado has appropriated for the construction of a bridge over the Grand river at a point near the intersection of the west end of Main St. in the city of Grand Junction with the said Grand river, the sum of  $6,480^{\text{c}}$ , and

Whereas, the estimated cost of a proper and suitable bridge across the said river at said point is  $40,000^{\text{c}}$  and

Whereas the County Commissioners of Mesa County have designated Thursday, September 16<sup>th</sup>, the hour of 2 o' Clock P.M. as the time for hearing requests for appropriations from Mesa County for said bridge, Now therefore be it resolved by the City Council of the said city of Grand Junction:

That the said commissioners be respectfully requested to appropriate not less than  $25,000^{\text{c}}$  in aid of the construction of the said bridge for the following reasons:

1<sup>st</sup>, the said bridge is longer and more expensive to construct than any of the other bridges recently constructed in Mesa County, for which bridges the

County Commissioners have appropriated the sum of \$15,000<sup>00</sup>

2<sup>nd</sup>: The city of Grand Junction, comprises a large proportion of the population of Mesa County, and if the said bridge is constructed, it will be of direct service to a larger proportion of the inhabitants of Mesa County than bridges constructed elsewhere.

3<sup>rd</sup>: The said City of Grand Junction pays in round numbers approximately one-fifth of the taxes collected by the said Mesa County, that a large portion of the funds of said County are expended upon the county roads and bridges outside of the City of Grand Junction, which takes entire care of its streets without assistance from the County.

Be it further Resolved that a committee of two Aldermen be appointed by the Mayor to present this resolution at the said meeting of the County Commissioners to be held on Thursday, September 16<sup>th</sup>, 1909.
