

Grand Junction Nov. 4th 1909

The City Council convened in adjourned session this evening at 8 o' Clock, Mayor Lee presiding.

The Clerk called the roll, to which the following Aldermen

Roll Call. responded as present. Campbell, Drew, Gasko

Holman, McCary, Magill. Ald. Gasko retired before canvass of Election returns was taken up.

Moved by Ald. Drew, and seconded by Ald. McCary that Police Magistrate J. Hill be appointed to take the place of Ald. Gasko on the canvassing board.

Upon call of motion, same was declared by the Mayor carried.

The Council then proceeded to canvass the returns of the general election held on Nov. 2nd 1909. Returns were opened and Council proceeded to canvass the votes for Commissioner of Public Affairs as 1st Choice, which canvass resulted as follows: D. W. Cusperle 415,

Judge Hill is appointed in place of Ald. Gasko on canvassing board.

W. H. Bannister 603, N. W. Longf. 99, E. B. Lutes 41, E. M. Stocomb 229,
 Thomas M. Todd 362, E. B. Lutes having the smallest number
 of 1st Choice votes, was dropped from the count, and Council
 proceeded to canvass the total of 1st + 2nd Choice votes of the
 remaining candidates, which resulted as follows.

Reppelle 608, Bannister 696, N. W. Longf. 330, E. M. Stocomb 586,
 Thomas M. Todd 655. N. W. Longf. having the smallest number
 of 1st + 2nd Choice votes, was dropped from the count, and
 Council proceeded to canvass the total of 1st, 2nd + 3rd Choice
 vote of the remaining candidates, which resulted as follows.

Reppelle 753, Bannister 739, E. M. Stocomb 912, Thomas M. Todd 1051
 Thomas M. Todd, having received the largest number of 1st, 2nd + 3rd
 Choice votes of the remaining candidates was declared elected.

The Council then proceeded to canvass the votes for
 Commission of Highways as 1st Choice, which canvass
 resulted as follows. John W. Armstrong 397, R. M. Hardinge 26,
 Henry B. Poterf 266, Thos. W. Rader, 535, S. J. Scovill 555.

 was dropped from the count, and council proceeded to
 canvass the total of 1st + 2nd Choice votes of the remaining
 remaining candidates, which resulted as follows.

 S. J. Scovill 939, S. J. Scovill having received a majority
 1st + 2nd Choice votes of the total of 1847 votes cast, was declared
 elected.

 837, W. F. Forbes 902. W. F. Forbes having received a majority
 of the votes cast for Commission of Finance & Supplies, was
 declared elected.

The Council then proceeded to canvass the votes for Commission
 of Water & Sewers, which resulted as follows. Mr. Bredelie 1,
 B. W. Hedder 1605, T. W. Rader 1, D. D. Torrythe 10, J. E. M. Kenzie 1,
 Geo. Touppaine 1, Wm. Bredelie 1, J. B. Mann. 1, T. J. Lee 1.

B. W. Hedder having received a majority of the votes cast for
 Commissioner of Water & Sewer, he was declared elected.

The council then proceeded to canvass the votes for
 Commissioner of Health & Civic Beauty as 1st Choice, which resulted
 as follows. Chas. Hacks 608, Chas. K. Holmberg 750, D. W. Wright 401
 Geo. Falconer 1. D. W. Wright having received the smallest
 number of votes from names printed on the ballot, and the

written name of Geo. W. Falconer, were dropped, and Council proceeded to canvass the total of 1st + 2nd Choice votes, which resulted as follows. Char. Gasho 733, Chas. N. Holmberg 950, Chas. Holmberg having received a majority of votes for of remaining candidates, was declared elected.

Ald. Drew introduced the following Resolution.

Be it resolved that the following named candidates be, and they are hereby declared to be the duly elected Commissioners of the City of Grand Junction, to wit; Thomas M. Todd as Commissioner of Public Affairs, Postwick W. Hedder as Commissioner of Water & Sewers.

W. T. Forbes as Commissioner of Finance & Supplies.

S. J. Scovill as Commissioner of Highways

Chas. N. Holmberg as Commissioner of Health & Civic Beauty.

Moved by Ald. Drew, and seconded by Ald. Holman, that resolution be adopted.

All the Aldermen present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Ald. M^cCary and seconded by Ald. Drew that Council reconsider motion passed at the meeting of Oct. 26 which motion was as follows. "That City Attorney be instructed to bring a suit against J. W. Rozzelle for damages, for failure to fulfill his contract calling for revision and compilation of the City ordinances"

The motion being put, the clerk called the roll, whereupon each Alderman as his name was called voted as follows. Campbell yea, Drew yea, Holman yea, M^cCary yea, Magill yea.

All the Aldermen present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The Mayor then put the original motion, the clerk called the roll, whereupon each Alderman as his name was called voted as follows. Gasho Nae, Campbell Nae, Drew Nae, Holman Nae, M^cCary Nae, Magill Nae.

All the Aldermen present having voted Nae, the Mayor declared the motion lost.
