

Grand Junction, Colo., Nov. 10, 1909.

Pursuant to adjournment the City Council met at 4 o'clock p. m.

Roll call. Upon call of roll the following commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Commissioner Holmberg placed in nomination for City Health Officer, Dr. Carl W. Plumb. There being no other nomination, the roll was called, and the following commissioners voted "yea" for the election of Dr. Carl W. Plumb to the office of City Health Officer: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Dr. Carl W. Plumb was declared to be the unanimous choice of the Council for City Health Officer.

The following appointments for the City Fire Department were presented to the Council by Mayor Todd:

E. L. Faulkner, Chief

E. H. Gilbert, Assistant Chief

Jos. Reese, Driver

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the appointments for the City Fire Department be confirmed by the Council.

Upon roll call the council voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea. All the commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the appointees for the Fire Department to be unanimously confirmed by the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that James W. Bucklin be elected to the office of City Attorney. The motion being put, the Commissioners, upon roll call, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and that James W. Bucklin was the unanimous choice of the council and duly elected to the office of City Attorney.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the following

resolution be adopted:

Be it Resolved by the City Council of the Grand Junction Daily News made official newspaper of the city for six months that the Grand Junction Daily News be, and the same is, hereby designated as the official newspaper of the said city of Grand Junction for six months for the publication of all ordinances and notices required by the Charter of said city and the Statutes of the State of Colorado to be published.

The motion being put, the commissioners, upon roll call, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmburg, yea.

Committee on Rules of Order of Business All the commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the resolution adopted, and the Grand Junction Daily News to be the official newspaper of the city for six months.

Mayor Todd appointed Commissioners Vorbeck and Holmburg as a Committee on Rules and Order of Business for the meetings of the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the following resolution be adopted:

Whereas, Section 63, Article VII of the Charter provides that each Commissioner shall maintain regular office hours at the City Hall,

Be it Therefore Resolved, that the office hours of the various Commissioners be, and they are hereby designated to be as follows:

- Commissioner of Public Affairs: from 11 to 12 a.m.
 - Com. of Water and Sewers: " 9 " 10 a.m.
 - Com. of Highways: " 10 " 11 a.m.
 - Com. of Health and Civic Beauty: " 9 " 12 a.m.
 - Com. of Finance and Supplies: " 9 " 12 a.m.
- and from 1 " 4 p.m.

The motion being put, the Commissioner, on roll call, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmburg, yea;

All the commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the Council pay W. H. Holman

Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as part payment on contract and other work at the City Pump house, and that a warrant be ordered drawn in favor of Mr. Holman on the Water fund for said amount.

Motion carried The motion being put, the Commissioners, on roll call, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The communication of Andrew L. Halligan, making application for a policeman's commission as special night watchman, without pay, was presented and read to the Council.

Appointed by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that Andrew L. Halligan be appointed a special night policeman, without pay.

The motion being put, ^{following} all the Commissioners voted yea, ^{Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmburg,} and Andrew L. Halligan was declared to be duly appointed as a night policeman, without pay.

Appointed by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the commission of R. D. Patterson as special policeman in the city of Grand Junction, without pay, be renewed.

The motion being put, all the Commissioners voted yea, and R. D. Patterson was declared to be duly appointed to act as special policeman without pay.

The report of J. H. Hill, as Police Magistrate, was presented and read to the Council, and referred to the City Clerk.

Moved by Com. Vedder and seconded by Com. Scovill that the Council adjourn until Thursday, November 11, at 4 o'clock p.m. Motion carried.

The Council adjourned to November 11, at 4 p.m.
