Five Hundred Dollars, (\$500<sup>00</sup>)

Pay of  
Teamsters  
fixed

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the pay of teamsters employed by the city be fixed at \$2.<sup>50</sup> (Two Dollars and fifty cents) per day, and twenty-five (25¢) cents additional for extra time in taking care of team.

The motion being put, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Surety Bonds,  
Required  
of the  
City Banks

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that, in accordance with the provisions of the Charter, the Banks of Grand Junction wherein the funds of the city are deposited shall be required to furnish surety bonds in amounts as follows:

Grand Valley National Bank, \$10,000<sup>00</sup>

Mesa County National Bank, \$10,000<sup>00</sup>

The Union Trust and Banking Co. \$5,000<sup>00</sup>,

and that the City Treasurer be instructed to procure the bonds from the said banks.

The motion being put, the vote was as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.
