

Grand Junction, Colo., November 16, 1909.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session, in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at the hour of four o'clock p. m.

The Commissioner of Public Affairs being absent, the City Clerk called the meeting to order.
