

Grand Junction, Colo., November 23, 1909

Council
convenes.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m.

Roll call.

Upon call of roll the following commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg. Absent, none.

The minutes of the meeting of November 16 were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the Commission of Highways be instructed

to construct a brick stable for the city on the rear of Lot 1, Block 127, the cost of the same not to exceed Twelve hundred (\$1200⁰⁰) dollars.

The motion being put, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Commissioner of Highways and the Mayor be instructed to let the contract for the brick work of the city barn.

The motion being put, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Mayor appoint a committee of three, to consist of himself and two other Commissioners, to consult with the City Attorney in the matter of preparing the ordinance fixing the salaries of all the city employes. The motion carried.

The Mayor appointed Commissioners Vedder and Vorbeck to act with him on said committee.

The official bonds of the following city officers having been examined by the City Attorney and found to be in proper form, it was moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that said bonds be approved, viz:

George L. Crawford, City Engineer, in the sum of Three Thousand Dollars.

James W. Bucklin, City Attorney, in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars

Everett L. Faulkner, Fire Chief and City Weigher, in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars.

The motion being put, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bonds approved.

The Depository Bond of the Mesa County National Bank, in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, (\$10,000.00) to the City of Grand Junction, having been examined by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that said bond be approved by the Council.

The motion being put, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the depository bond of the Mesa County National Bank approved.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the application of M. J. Ruthbard for a pawnbroker's license be laid on the table until the next regular meeting of the Council. The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the Council adjourn.

The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned.
