

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 30, 1909

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., Mayor Todd presiding.

Roll call Upon roll call the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scoville, Holmberg. Absent: none.

The minutes of the meetings of November 23^d and 24th were read and approved.

Petition for Street Light The petition of E. D. Ricker and forty other residents of the city, asking that a street light be placed at the intersection of Ouray avenue and Eleventh street, was presented and read to the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scoville that the petition be referred to the Mayor.

The motion carried and the petition was so referred.

Report Special Committee The special committee on letting contracts for the city's brick barn reported a bid for brick work received from Coombs + Atkinson for \$528.40, and that the contract had been let to said firm.

seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the action of the Committee in letting the contract for the brick work on the city barn be approved by the Council
