

Grand Junction, Colo., December 14, 1909

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

call
Upon call of roll the following commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg. Absent: none.

The minutes of the meetings of December 7, and December 8 were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the regular order of business be suspended in order that the Council may hear the gentlemen who were present to address the Council.

The motion carried.

Mr. J. W. Rozelle then appeared before the Council and stated that he was ready to complete the work of revising the City Ordinances, and agreed to meet the Council at an informal meeting on Thursday afternoon, Dec. 16, at 4 o'clock p. m., and explain what, in his opinion, needed to be done in the matter.

Mr. H. C. Rorick, of the firm of Spitzer & Co., of Toledo, Ohio, bond-buyers, was then introduced to the Council and spoke at some length on the subject of municipal and special assessment bonds, showing wherein, when they could be legally issued, the former were preferable by reason of their finding a readier and better market.

Moved by Commissioner Scovill and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Council adjourn until to-morrow at 4 o'clock p. m.
