

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 21, 1909.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the Chair.

Upon roll call the following Commissioners reported as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scoville, Holmberg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

The minutes of the meetings of December 14th and 15th were read and approved.

Commissioner Vedder now reported present.

Commissioner Vorbeck asked further time to report on communication of Mesa County National Bank in reference to interest on old issue of water

bond, which request was granted.

Commissioner Scovill, to whom had been referred the petition of the Independent Lumber Company asking permission to place a wagon scale on the south side of Main street, near the corner of Spruce, reported favorably on the petition and recommended that permission be granted to place scales at said point.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the report be accepted and the petition of the Independent Lumber Company be granted.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Mayor, the Commissioner of Water and Sewers and the Commissioner of Highways be appointed as a special committee to take up the matter of the proposed additions to the City.
