

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 24, 1909

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, after all the members thereof had been duly notified by the Mayor, convened in special session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 1:30 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call

Upon call of roll, the following commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbrck,



Scovill, Holmburg. Absent: none.

Resolution  
Introduced

The following resolution was introduced by Commission Vedder and was read to the Council by the Clerk:

Whereas, the Constitution and laws of the State authorize the appointment of a Police Magistrate in cities of the State of Colorado, by the City Council; and

Whereas, the City Charter of this City provides that the Mayor may be the Municipal Judge of said City; and

Whereas, Thomas M. Todd has been elected and is qualified and acting as such Mayor and Municipal Judge; and

Whereas, there is a vacancy in the office of said Police Magistrate, and

Whereas, it is desirable that no question be raised as to the judicial authority of the City, therefore be it

Resolved, That the said Thomas M. Todd be and hereby is appointed Police Magistrate for said City to fill such vacancy, if any there be.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Holmburg that the resolution just read be adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows:

Todd, blank vote; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmburg, yea.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the Council adjourn.

The motion carried and the Council then adjourned.
