The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, after all the members thereof had been duly notified by the Mayor, convened in special session in the City Hall, at 2 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon roll call, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that Mayor Todd and Commissioner Vedder be instructed to go to Florence, Colorado, for the purpose of obtaining all possible information in reference to the proposition of drilling for artesian water for the City; and that they ^{also} go to Fort Collins to investigate that city's water filtration plant now being constructed there; that they go to Greeley to investigate the water system of that city; and that they be authorized to make contracts for material or work in connection with the proposition of drilling for artesian water for the City.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.
