

Grand Junction, Colo., February 10, 1910.

Adjourned
Special
Session.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at 1:30 p.m. in the City Hall, pursuant to adjournment.

Upon roll call the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedde, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Motion carried Moved by Commissioner Scovill and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Mayor and the Commissioner of Water and Sewers be instructed to investigate the matter of the purchase of a road roll for the city while in Denver. The motion carried.

A proposed ordinance, entitled, "An Ordinance Providing for the Temporary Appointment of a Judge of the Municipal Court," was introduced and read by the Clerk.

The following resolution was introduced and read to the Council:

Resolution Introduced Whereas, Owing to the expected absence from the City at the same time of Mayor Thos. M. Todd, ex-officio Judge of the Municipal Court, and of Commissioner B. W. Vedder, who would become acting Mayor and ex-officio Judge of the Municipal Court during the absence of Mayor Thos. M. Todd, the City will be without the services of a Judge of the Municipal Court, and as the Charter and Ordinances do not provide for the appointment of a temporary Judge of the Municipal Court, it is therefore necessary to provide by an emergency ordinance for the appointment of such temporary Judge of the Municipal Court;

Therefore, Be it Resolved, That the following ordinance be passed as an emergency ordinance and go into effect at once, viz.:

Emergency Ordinance "An Ordinance Providing for the Temporary Appointment of a Judge of the Municipal Court."

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the resolution and Ordinance as read be adopted and ordered published.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

Resolution and Ordinance Adopted All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution and Ordinance adopted.

seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the Ordinance just passed be numbered 175. The motion carried.

A communication from Milne & Milne, in reference to the transfer work for the city, was read to the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the Council enter into a contract with Milne & Milne for the transfer work of the City, at the usual mercantile rates, for the period ending September 1st, 1910, ~~excepting~~ ^{carload shipments.}

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.
