Publication</sup> The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scoville, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the Mayor be authorized to order a new map made of the proposed addition to the City to replace the map which was accidentally burned.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scoville, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The matter of the consideration of the artesian well proposition was deferred to some future meeting of the Council.
