

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 1st, 1910

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Minutes Approved The minutes of the regular meeting of February 23^d and the adjourned session of February 24th were read and approved.

Motion Carried Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the petition of M. P. Ela and others, asking the City Council to take the necessary steps for sinking wells for the purpose of prospecting for artesian water, be granted and the petition placed on file.

Whereas, The Charter of the City of Grand Junction, by providing for a Department of Health and Civic Beauty, contemplates the improvement of the public parks and the beautifying of the city, and

Whereas, There has been appropriated for the care and maintenance of the public parks the sum of \$1,860, be it

and Civic Beauty be, and hereby is authorized, to expend out of the Park fund a sum not to exceed \$1,200⁰⁰ in the improvement and development of Maple Park in this city; and be it

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty be instructed to go to Boulder, Colorado, to consult with Mr. W. W. Parce, landscape architect, in reference to plans and specifications for developing and improving said Maple Park.
