

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 8, 1910

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p.m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Scovill, Holmberg. Absent: Commissioner Vorbeck.

The minutes of the regular meeting of March 1st and adjourned session of March 3^d, were read and approved.

A telegram from H. N. Steinbarger, Denver, stating that he would ship road roller on thirty days trial, was read to the Council.

A communication from Frank P. Woy, a consulting engineer of Madison, Wis., offering his services to the City, was read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the communication was ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the bills as read be allowed and warrants drawn for the several amounts.

Bills Allowed The motion being put, upon call of roll, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

Motion Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the Council accept the proposition of Hessick & Jones to drill an artesian well at \$3.00 per foot for 1200 feet, and \$3.50 per foot thereafter; that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up a contract accordingly, and that Hessick & Jones be required to furnish a bond of \$3,000.00 to complete the work according to contract.

Carried The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Motion Moved by Commissioner Scovill and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the Council authorize the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies to order a Case road roller, provided the Case Company makes a net price of \$1930.50 f.o.b. factory, and that the machine comes up to specifications and requirements.

Carried The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmberg, the Council adjourned.
