

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 15, 1910.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call

Upon roll call the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of March 8<sup>th</sup> and the adjourned sessions of March 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> were read and approved.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmberg the regular order of business was suspended in order to hear from the ladies present in the Council Chamber.

A number of ladies with their children appeared before the Council and asked for the removal of the Farmers ditch.

Mayor Todd stated the present status of the matter and assured the petitioners that the Council would do all in its power to have the ditch removed.

Petition

The petition of Joseph A. Quinn, asking for a permit to repair the frame house situated on Lot 1, in block 102, and to erect a board fence from the south end of house to alley line, thence on south end of lot for a distance of 80 feet, was presented and read to the Council.
