

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 29, 1910

- Regular Meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.
- Roll Call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg. City Attorney Bucklin was also present.
- Minutes approved. The minutes of the regular meeting of March 22^d were read and approved.
- Petition The petition of John Fuite for a plumber's license was presented and read to the Council.
- Referred On motion of Commissioner Holmberg seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers and the Mayor.
- Petition The Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty reported that while in Boulder he had employed Mr. W. W. Parce, landscape architect, to make plans for the improvement of the city park and to superintend the planting of shrubbery, etc.
- Disallowed Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the petition of the Western Slope Security Co., presented at the previous meeting of the Council and praying for the removal of the ditch on Twelfth street, be disallowed.
- The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.
- Communication All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.
- A communication from the Hessick & Jones Drilling Co., stating that the drilling apparatus had been shipped to Grand Junction, was read to the Council.
- Bond referred The bond of Hessick & Jones was read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was referred to the City Attorney.

Communication
 A communication from J. T. Nedwiede, Superintendent of the Rio Grande Junction Railway, together with an agreement in duplicate between the City of Grand Junction and said Company, covering pipe line crossings which were put in under agreement No. 494 and which expired by limitation December 31st, 1909, was presented and read to the Council.

Referred
 On motion of Commissioner Vorbick seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the communication and agreement was referred to the Mayor and City Attorney.

Motion On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty and the City Attorney were instructed to take up the matter of the amendment of the ordinance relating to city scavengers.

Motion Carried Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Commissioner of Highways be instructed to have curbing put in on Colorado avenue and Sixth street alongside Lots 1 and 2, Block 116, now occupied by the City Hall; and that the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty be instructed to have the same parked and beautified.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Adjourn Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Council adjourn until to-morrow afternoon at four o'clock.

The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned until Wednesday, March 30, at 4 o'clock p. m.
