Com. from State Board of Health Dr. Plumb, City Health Officer, appeared before the Council and read two communications received from the State Board of Health in reference to the muzzling of dogs and the quarantine of certain diseases.

Adjourned Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the Council adjourn.
