

Grand Junction, Colo., April 12, 1910.

Regular Meeting

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the Council Chamber, City Hall, with Mayor Todd presiding.

Roll call

Upon call of roll the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scoville, Holmberg.

Minutes approved

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 5, were read and approved.

Petition referred

A petition from J. P. Phalen, asking for a renewal of employment office license, was presented and read to the Council.

Petition referred

On motion of Commissioner Holmberg seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

A petition from E. B. Wilson and other residents of the northeast part of the City in reference to water supply, was presented and read to the Council.

On motion of Commissioner Holmberg seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

Plumber's petitions

The petitions of P. C. Lowe and C. J. Trobitz, asking for renewal of license to do plumbing work in this city, accompanied by the required bonds of \$1,000.00 each, were presented and read to the Council. The bonds were referred to City Attorney for examination.

Report of City Weigher referred to Mayor

The report of the City Weigher for the month of March was read to the Council, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmberg, the same was referred to the Mayor.

Report of Fire Chief accepted

The quarterly report of the City Fire Chief was presented and read to the Council, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Report of Com. of Water and Sewers referred to Auditor

The report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers of expenditures for quarter ending March 31st, 1910, was presented and read to the Council.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the report was referred to the Auditor.

Petition denied

The Mayor having reported adversely on the petition of the Perkins, Joslin Mercantile Co. to erect corrugated iron shed, it was moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the petition be refused. The motion carried.

Petition granted

The Commissioner of Highways reported favorably on the petition of C. G. Simpson and others for a cement sidewalk on the south side of Grand Avenue, between Twelfth and Thirteenth streets.

Sidewalks ordered

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the petition be granted and sidewalk ordered laid.

Trobitz having been approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scoville that the said P. C. Lowe and C. J. Trobitz be granted plumbers' licenses and that their bonds be placed on file. The motion carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read by the Clerk:

Resolution Resolved, That the building located on Lot 17, in Block 103, being within the fire limits, be and the same is hereby declared a nuisance, and condemned pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 6, Sections 7, 8, and 9 thereof, for the reason that said building has become and now is unsafe and dangerous.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the resolution as read be adopted.

Adopted The motion carried, and the Mayor declared the resolution adopted.

Motion Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Holmburg that the Council employ Duince Hutton as Plumbing Inspector for the City for one month at a salary of \$85.00 for the one month.
