The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session, at 4 o'clock p. m., in the Council Chamber, City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder. City Attorney Bucklin was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 12th and adjourned session of April 15th were read and approved.

The petition of John McGetrick, asking for permission to erect a frame porch on the south side of house, situated on the

northwest corner of First and Main streets, was
 Petition read to the Council.

Referred On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded
 by Commissioner Scovill, the petition was
 referred to the Mayor with power to act.

Application for Building Inspector The application of J. W. Kurtz for the
 appointment of Building Inspector, accompanied

 read to the Council.

Whereas, The Charter of the City of Grand Junction provides that the fiscal year shall begin on January 1st and end on December 31st, therefore be it

Resolved, That all licenses expiring April 1st, 1910, and all new licenses issued during this fiscal year, shall terminate on the 31st day of December, 1910, and that the license fee shall be pro rata on all renewed licenses; and

Resolved, That the Mayor and City Clerk be instructed to issue licenses accordingly

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the resolution as read be adopted.

The motion carried and the Mayor declared the resolution adopted.
