

Grand Junction, Colo., May 3, 1910.

Regular Session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the Council Chamber, City Hall.

The Mayor being absent, the clerk called the meeting to order.

On the motion of Commissioner Scovill, seconded by Commissioner Holmberg, Commissioner Vorbeck was elected chairman pro. tem.

Roll Call

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg. Absent: Commissioners Todd and Vedder.

A quorum being present, the Council proceeded to business.

The City Attorney, Mr. Bucklin was present at this meeting.

Minutes Approved

The minutes of the previous meeting, April 26<sup>th</sup>, were read and approved.

Quarterly Report of Clerk accepted

The quarterly report of the city clerk, having been referred to and reported found correct by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, it was moved by Commissioner Scovill and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg, that the report be accepted and placed on file.

Bills  
allowed

Moved by Commissioner Scovill and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called voted as follows: Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the following resolution be adopted:

Resolution

Whereas, In accordance with Ordinance No. 164, passed and adopted on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of June, A.D. 1909, the City of Grand Junction issued "\$65,000" Refunding Bonds at 5 per cent. to take the place of a like amount of Water Bonds dated May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1897, bearing 6 per cent. interest, and,

Whereas, said Refunding Bonds were dated July 1<sup>st</sup>, 1909, in accordance with said ordinance, but owing to various delays on the part of the purchasers of said bonds, the delivery of said bonds was not made until November, 1909, and

Whereas, the City Treasurer advertised a call for the old refunded issue, limiting interest on same to July 27<sup>th</sup>, 1909, and

Whereas, the City received from the purchasers of said refunding issue the interest at 5 per cent. to November 1<sup>st</sup>, 1909, and

Whereas, it is the sense of this Council that, inasmuch as the City received from the purchasers of the new bonds interest

to November 1<sup>st</sup>, that it is only just and right that the City pay interest on the old bonds for a like period, but at the rate of 5 per cent., which is the amount that would be payable if the new issue had not been delayed and had been issued on July 1<sup>st</sup>, according to the ordinance; Be it Therefore

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be, and he is hereby instructed to pay 5 per cent. interest on said old Refunded Bonds for the period from July 27<sup>th</sup> to November 1<sup>st</sup>, 1909.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, at a regular adjourned meeting held on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1909, did by resolution designate the Grand Junction Daily News as the official newspaper of the City of Grand Junction for six months, and

Whereas, the time for which said newspaper was so designated is about to expire, Be it Therefore

Resolved, By the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that the Grand Junction Daily News be, and the same is hereby designated as the official newspaper of said city for and until the

end of the current fiscal year, (December 31, <sup>31st</sup> 1910) for the publication of all ordinances and notices required by the Charter of said City and the Statutes of the State of Colorado to be published, and all notices that may be ordered published by any Commissioner or the City Council of said City.
