

Grand Junction, Colo., May 6, 1910.

Adjourned
session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in adjourned session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

The Mayor then put the original motion on the adoption of the resolution, and upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, no; Vorbeck, no; Scovill, no; Holmberg, no.

All the Commissioners present having voted no, the Mayor declared the motion lost and the resolution rescinded.

The following resolution was read by the Clerk:

Resolution Whereas, In accordance with Ordinance No. 164, passed and adopted on the 22^d day of June, 1909, the City of Grand Junction issued \$65,000.00 Refunding Bonds at 5 per cent. to take the place of a like amount of Water Bonds, dated May 1st, 1897, bearing 6 per cent. interest and

Whereas, Said Refunding Bonds were dated July 1st, 1909, in accordance with said ordinance, but owing to various delays, the delivery of said bonds was not made until November, 1909, and

Whereas, the City Treasurer advertised

a call for the old refunded bonds, limiting interest on same to July 27th, 1909, and

Whereas the City received from the purchasers of said refunding bonds the interest to November 1st, 1909, and

Whereas, it is the sense of this Council, that, inasmuch as the city received from the purchasers of the new bonds interest to November 1st, it is just and right that the city pay interest on the old bonds for a like period; Be it therefore

Resolved, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be, and he is hereby instructed to pay interest on said old refunded bonds for the period from July 27th to November 1st, 1909, at 6 per cent.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the resolution as read be adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows:

Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea;
Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the Council adjourned.
