

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 31, 1910.

Regular Meeting

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p.m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call

Upon call of roll the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

Minutes Approved

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 24th, and adjourned sessions of May 26th and 27th were read and approved.

Mr. J. M. Sampliner appeared before the Council and called attention to Rapid Creek as a source of mountain water supply for the City, and urged that the Council make an examination of the same.

Motion

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, the Mayor and the City Engineer be instructed to investigate the water supply of Rapid Creek, and report the results of such investigation to the Council from time to time.

Carried

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, aye; Vorbeck, aye; Scovill, aye; ^{Holmburg, aye.} All the Commissioners present having voted aye, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

A communication from Dr. Carl W. Plumb, City Health Officer, recommending

that the house at 909 Colorado avenue be con-
demned, for the reason that it is impossible to
properly fumigate same, was read to the Council.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded
by Commissioner Seovill, the communication
was referred to the Commissioner of Health
and Civic Beauty and the City Attorney.

A communication from Edward G. Hill, State
Chemist, was read to the Council. The com-
munication gave report on examination of 27
specimens of water from Grand Junction, and
reported Colon bacilli (typhoid germ) present in
nos. 5, 7, 8 and 21 - nos. 5 and 8 being water taken
from Grand river at or near main sewer outlet;
no. 7 being ditch water, and 21 from hydrant
at Emerson school.
