

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 7, 1910.

Regular Meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scoville, Holmburg.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Minutes Approved The minutes of the regular meeting of May 31st were read and approved.

Petition read The petition W. Guy Boyer, J. A. Munson and thirty-six other business firms and citizens of Grand Junction, asking the Council to amend present ordinance or pass a new ordinance permitting the display of electric signs before their places of business, was presented and read to the Council.

Referred On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty and the Mayor.

Report of Fire Chief and City Weigher The report of the Fire Chief and the City Weigher for the month of May was presented and read to the Council, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Scoville, the report was referred to the Mayor.

Communication read A communication from a Committee of the Mesa County Medical Society in reference to the typhoid fever situation in this city, was read to the Council, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Scoville, the communication was ordered placed on file.

A Proposed Ordinance Introduced
Commissioner Holmberg introduced a proposed Ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance for the Preservation of the Public Health," and the same was read to the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the proposed ordinance be laid on the table until the next regular meeting. The motion carried.

The Mayor announced the appointment of Oris O. Phillips as Fire Chief and City Weigher.

O. O. Phillips Appointed and Confirmed Fire Chief
Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the appointment of Oris O. Phillips as Fire Chief and City Weigher be confirmed by the Council.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea. All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the appointment confirmed.

The bond of Oris O. Phillips as Fire Chief and City Weigher having been examined by the City Attorney and found to be in proper form, it was moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the bond be accepted and placed on file.

Bond Approve
The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bond accepted.

The bond of G. R. Robinson, for carrying on the business of plumbing, having been approved by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers and the City Attorney, to whom the same has been referred, it was moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scoville that the bond be accepted and placed on file.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scoville, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bond accepted.

Mayor Todd announced the appointment of John J. Allison as a regular Policeman.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the appointment of John J. Allison as a regular Policeman, (his appointment to date from the first day of June) be confirmed by the Council.
