Chemist

A communication from Dr. Edward C. Hill, State Chemist, giving a report on examination of four samples of water, was read to the Council. The report on samples numbered 1 and 2, being water from Perry's distilled water plant and Glenwood Springs mountain water respectively, showed color bacilli present in those waters.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the following resolution be adopted:

Whereas, The examination and analysis made by Dr. Edward C. Hill, State Chemist, of the distilled water from the Perry plant of this city and the Glenwood Springs mountain water show color bacilli present in those waters, and

Whereas, both of those waters are being sold to citizens of this city, be it

Resolved, That the distilled water from the Perry plant and the Glenwood Springs mountain water be declared injurious and detrimental to the health of this city; and be it further

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty and the City Health Officer be authorized and instructed to stop the sale of the said distilled water from the Perry plant and the Glenwood Springs mountain water in this city.
