Adjournment  
Session The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 10 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scoville, Holmberg.

Ordinance Consideration by section, of the proposed Health Ordinance.

The proposed ordinance, entitled, "An Ordinance for the Preservation of the Public Health," was then read as a whole.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that

Lewis for slaughtering cattle and selling the same in this city.

Communication  
A communication from J. M. Billings, J. A. K. Crawford and J. A. Beemer in reference to the blockading of Lawrence avenue in this city by the Railroad Companies, was read to the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the communication be referred to the Mayor, the Commissioner of Highways and the City Attorney, with power to act.

Motion Carried  
The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Referred to Mayor as Com. of Highways  
Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Holmburg that the matter of opening Fourth street to the river be referred to the Mayor and the Commissioner of Highways. The motion carried.
