

Grand Junction, Colo., July 15, 1910.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, in the City Hall, at 4 o'clock p.m., with Mayor Todd presiding.

The following Commissioners were present at roll call: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg. City Attorney Bucklin was present.

A proposed contract between Hessick & Jones, of Florence, Colorado, and the City of Grand Junction for the drilling of an artesian well near the city reservoir, was read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the contract for the drilling of an artesian well near the city reservoir be entered into between the City of Grand Junction and Hessick & Jones, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and instructed to sign the same for the City.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that, whereas Hessick & Jones have satisfactorily completed their contract with the city for drilling an artesian well, entered into on the 12th day of March, 1910, the Clerk be authorized to return the bond given by the said Hessick & Jones for the faithful performance of said contract. The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Scovill and
seconded by Commissioner Vedder that
the Council adjourn.
