A Resolution declaring the intention of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, to Create a Local Public Improvement District in the City of Grand Junction to be known as Danitary Sewer District Number Three.

Whereas, it appears to the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, and the Council so finds, that there exists an immediate ne cessity for the creation of a sanitary sewer district therein to be known as Sanitary Sewer Dewir District Number Three within the boundaries herein after described, and of the construction therein of a system of samitary sewers for sanitary drainage therein, tory, Therefore, Be is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Section 1. That the leity Engineer of the City of Grand Junction be, and he is hereby, ordered and directed to prepare full details and specifications for the construction of a system of Sanitary sewers within the following described boundaries, which boundaries shall include territory to be known as Sanitary Sewer District Yumber Three, And said Engineer shall make and farnish, an estimate of the total cost of said improvement exclusive of the percentum for the cost of collection and other incidentals and of interest to the time the first installment of the Cost becomes the first installment of the Cost becomes due, and a map of the district, from which map the approximate share of the total cost that will be assessed upon each piece of real estate in the district may be readily ascertained.
