A petition from Edwin Price and others, asking that the fire limits be extended to the north half of Block 127, was presented and read to the Council.

On motion of Commissioner Holmberg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the

petition was referred to the Mayor and the Commissioner of Highways.

Report of Municipal Judge accepted
The quarterly report of the Judge of the Municipal Court having been examined and found correct by the Auditor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmberg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Report of Com. of Pub. Affairs accepted

A Proposed Ordinance Read
The consideration of a proposed ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Providing for the Erection of Signs and the Maintenance of the Same in a Safe Condition, and Providing Penalties for a Violation of the Provisions of this Ordinance," was taken up and read to the Council.
