

Grand Junction, Colo., August 12, 1910.

Adjourned  
session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in adjourned session in the City Hall, at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scoville, Holmberg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

Report of

Mayor Todd and Commissioner Scoville, to whom had been referred the matter of amending the ordinance in reference to sidewalk construction and defining curb lines, submitted verbal report. Mayor Todd recommended making the curb line 15 feet from the property line on all 80-ft streets, and 22 feet on all 100-ft streets. Commissioner Scoville recommended making the curb line 20 feet from the property line on all 100-ft streets.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that



the City Attorney be instructed to draw an ordinance amending Ordinance No. 167, "An ordinance defining sidewalk and curb lines and prescribing materials for sidewalk construction in the City of Grand Junction," so as to fix the line of the curb twenty-two feet from the property line on all streets one hundred feet wide, and fifteen feet from the property line on all streets eighty feet wide; also amending section 7 of said ordinance so as to provide that the concrete shall be laid not less than  $3\frac{1}{4}$  inches thick, with a cap or top dressing not less than  $3\frac{1}{4}$  inch thick.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Seovill, no; Holmberg, yea.

A majority of the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmberg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned to Monday, August 15, at 4 o'clock p.m.
