

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 16, 1910.

Regular Meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session in the City Hall at 4 o'clock p.m., with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call. Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Scovill.

Minutes Approved. City Attorney Bucklin was present. The minutes of the regular meeting of August 9, and adjourned sessions of August 12, 15 and 16, were read and approved.

Petition for Sidewalk. The petition of F. M. Campbell and V. E. Northrop, asking the Council to order a cement sidewalk laid on the south side of Block No. 46, being the north side of Chipeta avenue from 10th to 11th streets, was presented and read to the Council.

Petition Granted. Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the petition be granted and the sidewalk ordered laid.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Report of Special Committee. Commissioner Vorbeck, ^{and Mayor Todd} of the special committee to whom had been referred the matter of granting concession privileges to the Mesa County Fair Association during the week of the County Fair, reported adversely to granting such privileges.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmburg that the report of the committee be accepted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, no; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea. A majority of the Com-

missioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the report accepted.
