Session The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the Council Chamber, City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Minutes
Approved The minutes of the regular meeting of August 30 and adjourned session of August 31 were read and approved.

Order
Suspended A number of citizens being in waiting to address the Council, the regular order of business was suspended in order that they might be heard.

J.H. Rankin
addressed
Council J.H. Rankin addressed the Council on the subject of road construction, stating that the Chamber of Commerce, which he represented, had investigated the matter and obtained considerable information and data in reference to the use of crushed rock and gravel for road and street construction, and urged the construction of a section of such road in this city by way of experiment.

Motion
Carried Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that a committee, consisting of the Commissioner of Highways and the Mayor, be appointed to take up the matter of the construction of the proposed road with the Chamber of Commerce. The motion carried.

J.M. Sampliner and other citizens present addressed the Council, and asked for the report of the City Engineer on the cost of the paving in the proposed paving district.

City Engineer

City Engineer Geo. L. Crawford made a verbal report on estimated cost of paving in the proposed paving district, stating the kind of paving for streets and alleys, and in answer to questions, gave the estimated cost to each lot for paving.

City Attorney Bucklin spoke of the legal phase and status of the paving proposition, and also addressed the Council as a citizen and taxpayer, favoring the proposed paving of the business section of the city.

J. M. Samplina then addressed the Council on the subject of paving, and urged that the matter of paving in the proposed paving district be indefinitely postponed.

Mayor Todd, speaking for the Council, stated that the Commissioners had gone ahead and acted on the petition presented to a former Council, but the present Council was not going to force paving upon the property owners if they did not want it. The Council will have the proposed district paved if the people want it; if they do not want it, the Council will direct its energies to other matters.

The Council then took up the regular order of business, and the reports of the City Weigher and Fire Chief for the month of August were received and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill the reports were referred to the Mayor.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

Proof of Publication Accepted The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance to Amend certain Sections of Ordinance No. 167 entitled 'An Ordinance Defining Sidewalk and Curb Lines and Prescribing Materials for Sidewalk Construction in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado,'" was read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the proof of publication as read be accepted. The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg

and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage. The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the last paragraph of section one of said proposed ordinance be and hereby is amended so as to read as follows: "All sidewalks shall be sixteen (16) feet wide on Main street from Second street to Seventh street."

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the amendment adopted.

The Clerk then read the proposed ordinance as amended.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the proposed ordinance as amended and entitled, "An Ordinance to Amend Certain Sections of Ordinance No. 167, entitled 'An Ordinance Defining Sidewalk and Curb Lines and Prescribing Materials for Sidewalk Construction in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado,'" be passed and adopted and ordered published.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the Ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the Ordinance just passed and adopted be numbered 182. The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Scovill, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned to Friday, September 9, at 10 o'clock a. m.
