

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 9, 1910.

Adjourned session The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 10 o'clock a.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Petition for Sidewalks. The petition of T. S. Ramey and others, asking that a sidewalk be laid along the south side of Hill avenue between Fifth and Sixth streets, was presented and read to the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Scovill and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the petition be granted and the sidewalk ordered laid.

Whereas, The notice to owners of real estate in Sewer District known and designated as Sanitary Sewer District No. 3, in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and to others interested therein, said notice having been published in the Daily News, a daily newspaper published in the city of Grand Junction, for five days each week for two consecutive weeks, beginning same on August 9, A. D. 1910, and ending with August 19, A. D. 1910, provided that all complaints and objections concerning the proposed improvements should be made in writing by the owners of any real estate to be assessed, or by any person interested, on or before 10 o'clock A. M. on the 9th day of September, A. D. 1910;

Whereas, The City Council of the said City of Grand Junction, in session, at the time designated in said notice, and no complaints or objections concerning the proposed improvements have been made in writing or otherwise by any owner of real estate to be assessed, or by any person interested;

Therefore, be it Resolved, That the time for receiving complaints or objections to said proposed improvements has expired, and that the ordering of said improvements shall be continued until Tuesday, the 20th day of September, 1910, or to such time thereafter as the matter can be reached.
